South African Textile Sector: A Bright Future and Open for Investment

Since 2010, the South African textile, clothing, leather and footwear sector has experienced a resurgence after almost being brought to its knees by an influx of cheaper imports. The revival of the sector is linked to the introduction of the Government's Clothing & Textiles Competitiveness Program (CTCP), and focus of the Industrial Policy Action Plan (IPAP) which has given local industry players a much-needed platform from which to launch a competitive sector.

The sector has significant potential for job creation, not only at factory level, but also in the downstream value chain where small-scale farmers supply processed input materials such as cashmere (from indigenous goat wool), sheep wool, wild silk and cotton.

The industry is unique in many ways, one of which being that four out of five workers are women. Additionally, a major challenge is the inability to compete with countries such as China, India and Vietnam which are able to produce much cheaper goods. Participating in the sector requires not just capital, but requisite skills and research capabilities.

The South African Government has released its 10th Industrial Policy Action Plan (IPAP), with a sharp focus on deepening industrial development, speeding up radical economic transformation, and increasing the ability to produce value-added products. The revival of the clothing and textiles sector is an integral part of this Plan.

As part of this strategy, a delegation of twenty-two emerging South African designers are participating at the Torino Fashion Week 2018 to find new markets, expose their brands and talent, and meet potential partners to improve and innovate their manufacturing skills and take the South African fashion industry forward.
